

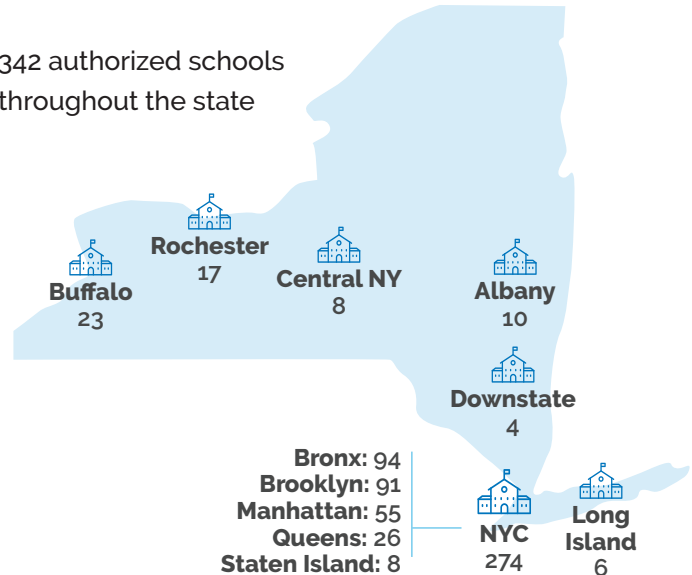

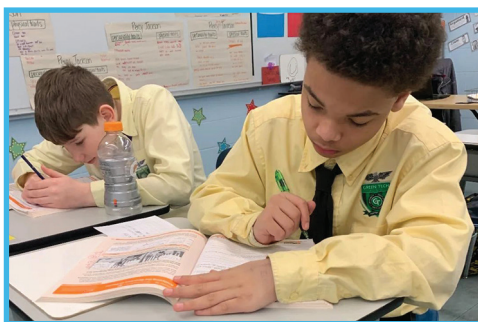

All parents should have the freedom to pick the right school for their child's individual needs. Many parents in low-income communities do not have any options outside their local traditional public school. New York's public charter schools give these parents and students additional high-quality options that they desperately need.

About Charter Schools in the Capital Region/ Hudson Valley/Westchester areas

As of Fall 2023, there are **14 public charter schools** operating in the Capital Region/Hudson Valley/Westchester areas **serving nearly 5,900 students**. Like their counterparts throughout the state, each of the public charter schools currently operating in these areas completed a rigorous approval process to open and clearly demonstrated an existing community need for their services. And as evidenced by recent [NYS assessment data](#), public charter schools are working. Students in grades 3-8 from public charter schools perform 7 percentage points better than all public schools statewide in both ELA and Math and tested a larger portion of their students with disabilities than any other type of school in the state.



About Our Programming

Schools work best when teachers have the freedom and time to personalize student learning. Public charter schools have more autonomy over their staffing, budget, educational program, school culture, and professional development than traditional public schools. That autonomy is why public charter schools are known for finding new ways to use technology, increase teacher involvement, and craft creative lesson plans.

Families within the Capital Region/Hudson Valley/Westchester areas can find unique public charter school options such as:

Nurses Middle College Charter High School - Capital Region...

Preparing a diverse group of students to **become the highly educated and professional nursing workforce of the future.**

Little Water Preparatory Charter School...

Infusing **the arts and real-world, project-based learning** throughout every component of the school day.

Henry Johnson Charter School...

Providing an **extended focus on English Language Arts**, with up to three hours daily devoted to reading and writing.

Green Tech High Charter School...

Providing young men in grades 6-12 with a **hybrid learning environment** of four days of on-campus instruction and one day of virtual instruction each week throughout the school year.
