What Charters Offer Students

Public charter schools have the freedom to innovate in their educational approaches, while remaining accountable to the same standards of public district schools. Public charter schools offer rigorous academic programs aimed at addressing learning gaps, preparing students for success in the next levels of their education and careers, and delivering skills needed for the 21st century economy. Often serving students for whom traditional schools were ineffective, public charter schools develop personalized learning approaches and interventions. Their autonomy over staffing, budget, programs, school culture, and professional development.

NY's public charter schools specialize in areas such as:

- Addressing achievement gaps
- Serving diverse student populations
- A wide range of student needs, including:
 - o Autism
 - o Dyslexia
 - Literacy Acquisition
- Over-age and under-credited students
- Computer engineering / computer science
- Law and social justice
- Military preparation
- Music and performing arts
- STEM / STEAM education
